

President's Report August 2023

NOTABLE



Community Education had a busy Summer! There were 17 programs with 192 participants. The focus of our previous summer offerings was changed to "hands-on" workshops and a twist to Comet Talks, introducing the new Comet Walk! The CCC Comets had a great year raising funds and awareness for cancer research and treatment. 11 people participated in climbing up Snowbowl Road and raised \$1,874 Thanks to everyone who supported us through the year.

Kathryn Kozak, Math Faculty, attended a symposium on Mathematics Education for the future in Oxford, England. Mathematics educators worldwide were in attendance, and Kathryn was exposed to many different cultures and how they approach mathematics education.

Maya Lanzetta, Math Faculty, attended the kickoff for a yearlong project she is involved in through the U of A. The project is creating a Community of Practice for a Culturally Affirming Precalculus Curriculum. The community of practice will meet monthly for the entire academic year.

Spanish Faculty, Katie Schwartz, was selected as 1 of 15 Fulbright Scholars to participate in the Summer Seminar for post-secondary educators for four weeks in July 2023. This year's seminar's theme was celebrating and learning more about the 200 years of bilateral relations between the US and Mexico. The seminar kicked off at the University of New Orleans over the 4th of July holiday, and two days later, the group was flown to Mexico City and welcomed by the US-Mexican Consulate and Mexican Ambassador, Julian Ventura Valero. The group attended daily conferences by scholars in universities across Mexico and received tours of prominent museums and heritage sites. In México, they traveled to México City, Cuernavaca, Puebla, Veracruz, Guadalajara, Tequila and Tlaquepaque, San Miguel de Allende, Lagos de Moreno, Monterrey and Tijuana. To finalize this seminar, Professor Schwartz was



asked to create a curriculum project that would take what she learned during her month in Mexico to teach her students about Mexican culture and some of the bilateral issues both countries share.



Katie Schwartz will be presenting at the upcoming AZLA (Arizona Language Association) Conference at NAU. Her presentation is titled "Make Study Abroad Accessible for Students and Educators." She will be sharing her experience creating a study abroad experience for her community college students that is accessible and affordable. She will also share how educators can apply for fully funded study abroad experiences to help internationalize their curriculum through Fulbright summer seminars abroad. Her presentation will include resources and materials that other language teachers can use to create and pursue opportunities for themselves and their students.

Additionally, Katie took 10 CCC and NAU students to study abroad in Mexico City, Mexico. Each program day was spent visiting an important historical and cultural site. Some of the places they visited include the Templo Mayor and Metropolitan Cathedral, Frida Kahlo's Casa Azul, the Teotihuacán Pyramids, and the lake of Xochimilco (so-chee-meel-koh), upon which the city was built. Each day, students were asked to reflect on a question the instructor, Katie Schwartz, posed through group discussion or journaling. Then, these reflections were compiled into a final project, and this curriculum project was the basis of the course and the project request by the Fulbright Commission of Seminars Abroad. Overall, the trip was a great success!

PARTNERSHIPS

The Higher Education Child Care Project (HECCP) at Northern Arizona University (NAU) is a pilot program funded by the Arizona Department of Economic Security (DES) Division of Child Care through federal Child Care and Development Block Grant COVID-19 relief funds. This program's main objective is to provide child care assistance to student-parents who meet the eligibility criteria. Recently, HECCP expanded its eligibility requirements to include CCC2NAU students attending Coconino Community College. As a result, eligible CCC2NAU students may now qualify for child care expense reimbursements through HECCP until June 2024.

In the fall of 2022, the Community College Consortium (CCC) and BetterMynd joined forces to offer a free mental health service for students, addressing the pressing issue of student mental health. This partnership attracted 138 students who recognized the initiative's importance and registered for BetterMynd accounts, highlighting their willingness to seek help for their well-being. Over the program's duration, 168 counseling sessions were scheduled, with 97 considered successful, demonstrating students' engagement and the program's effectiveness in providing ongoing support. Session frequency varied, with some students attending multiple sessions, showcasing the program's flexibility. BetterMynd received high user ratings, with an impressive average app rating of 9.67 out of 10, reflecting its user-friendly nature. Additionally, the average counselor rating was 9.33 out of 10, indicating the quality and effectiveness of the counseling services provided. Data also revealed prevalent mental health concerns among students, with general anxiety affecting 67%, depression at 60%, and academic distress impacting 44%. Social anxiety (41%), relationship issues (30%), and post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD)-related trauma (29%) were also significant concerns. In summary, the CCC and BetterMynd partnership successfully offered accessible mental health support to students, as evidenced by high registration numbers, successful counseling sessions, positive user ratings, and insights into common mental health concerns. This initiative played a vital role in addressing the well-being of college students.

CCC recently became an official partner of St. Mary's Food Bank (SMFB). This partnership is a significant milestone that paves the way for CCC to participate in SMFB's "Agency Shopping" program through the Flagstaff Family Food Center. As a result, CCC will soon be equipped with newly stocked shelves conveniently located in the Crater, which will serve as a vital resource for the entire college community, including faculty, staff, and students.

This achievement would not have been possible without the dedicated efforts of individuals like Kirsten Mead, Franchelle Tohannie, Jessica Burke, Juanita Tarango, Derik Yellowhair, Brian Francis, and Simon Chief. Their commitment to volunteering played a pivotal role in ensuring the success of this new partnership. Their contributions have laid the foundation for what promises to be a beneficial initiative for the college community.

CCC aspires to broaden its support base and involve more employees in stocking and distributing food from CCC's Comet Cupboard. With the support of a growing team of volunteers, CCC aims to significantly address food insecurity within its community in the coming weeks and months.

The High Country Training Academy graduated its second class this August. The third class begins in October.



Workforce Training sponsored the second Film Production Assistant course in August. The week-long, 45-hour intensive course was taught at the Fourth Street campus and is a partnership with the Arizona Film Commission and CCC. Five other Arizona community colleges are also offering the course. 39 participants earned their completion certificate. Plans are in place to offer the course in May and August 2024.

The Community Education program received a \$2000 grant from the Flagstaff Arizona Community Foundation to help with two workshops: Stained Glass and Metalworking for Jewelry. The funding will be used to purchase tool kits for these ongoing workshops to make them more affordable. In the past, offering these workshops has been logistically challenging since the tools are costly for participants to buy, and instructors rarely have enough for everyone.

The Page Center hosted its third CDL Class A Training course. Phoenix Truck Driving School comes to Page once a quarter, using a maneuvering space at the Page Airport. In the academic year 2022-23, there were 150 program participants.
