A quick word from the President

Dear Friends,

As the summer Monsoons have arrived to deliver muchneeded moisture to our beautiful county, Coconino Community College faculty and staff are in the middle of making preparations to welcome students to a new academic year.

Programs, like Computer Information Systems, have been refreshed to meet the needs of industry. New programs, like Adult Education for the Havasupai Reservation, have begun. Community education offerings have gone from the idea phase into becoming reality.

Also on the horizon in November will be Prop. 417, a ballot initiative to extend the current secondary property tax. This is not a request for a tax increase, but rather for a continuation of the secondary property tax that is presently in place. State funding for community colleges has dropped by 64 percent, which has significantly affected the programs the College has been able to provide. If approved, the funding from Prop. 417 would allow CCC to respond to requests from our community members and business partners to expand our workforce development programs and lifelong learning offerings.

CCC remains committed to being a dedicated partner to all who call Coconino County home, and we also hold steadfast to our love of community. As I am fond of saying, "The story of CCC is really the story of our students and our communities."

Beginning this month, we will introduce you to some of our wonderful students and the stories they have to tell.

CCC District Governing Board puts it to voters to continue secondary tax to support educational programs

The Coconino Community College District Governing Board voted in February to ask voters to consider a continuation of a secondary tax levy that was approved 20 years ago for the construction of College buildings.

If approved, the secondary tax would


Computer Information Systems degree, certifications refreshed for industry needs

In the fall, Coconino Community College will be offering, under the umbrella of the CCC2Work mission, a "refreshed" Computer Information Systems degree and certificates, said Jeff Jones, Dean of Career and Technical Education. The CIS refresh will align the program with new industry standards of the Computing Technology Industry Association, or CompTIA.

Because CompTIA is a growing industry standard in computer networking, security and technology, CCC is making sure that new classes and curriculum align with CompTIA certificates of A+, Network+, Linux+ and Security+

"This will allow our graduates to not only complete our programs but achieve relevant industry certifications to ensure that they are competitive in today's constantly changing technology field," Jones said.

CCC 'hybrid' classes coming to Grand Canyon

Instructors will teach at the famed Albright Center twice a week

People at the Grand Canyon interested in taking CCC courses without driving to Flagstaff will be able to do so beginning this fall.

The College will be offering 'hybrid' classes, which are a combination of online and in-person courses that will allow students to get to meet and ask questions of their instructors face to face. Instructors will travel to the Grand Canyon twice a month on Fridays to teach the students in the Albright Center at Grand Canyon National Park.

MAT 088: PreAlgebra
SPC 100: Public Speaking
ENG 099: Fundamentals of Composition
